\* The SSAE grants support programs to reduce bullying, improve school climate, reduce the use of suspensions and increase availability of technology in schools

\*\* The 21<sup>st</sup> Century Community Learning Centers program provides supports for after-school programming, and can be used to help fund full service community schools.

+ The federal government's Charter Schools Program provides grants to state departments of education, individual charter schools or charter management organizations to expand charter schools or create new schools
